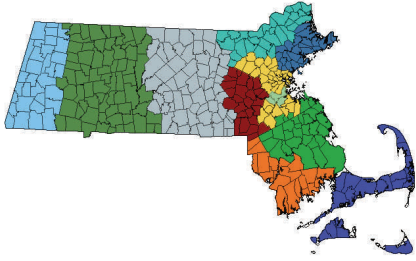


Massachusetts Association of Independent Living Centers



Independent Living's core mission is to help people with disabilities live in the community of their choice. In FY '12, the eleven Independent Living Centers in Massachusetts spent over 58,000 hours working with **15579 individuals**. While we had many successes, some consumers encountered insurmountable barriers with inadequate accessible and affordable housing being the most serious. Transportation, community services, and employment opportunities are also still insufficient.

FY '12 IL Facts

Goal: Get people out of nursing homes
Achieved: 213 people relocated to the community
Savings to the state per person: \$20,000
TOTAL SAVINGS TO THE STATE: \$4,260,000

Goal: Prevent placement into nursing homes
Achieved: 83 people used IL services to avoid placement
Savings to the state per person: \$20,000
TOTAL SAVINGS TO THE STATE: \$1,660,000

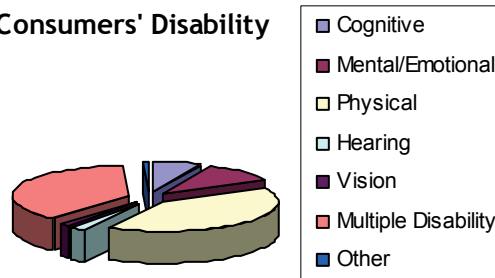
